





After the celebration of Christmas, we begin the season of **Epiphany** which begins January 6 and continues until Ash Wednesday starts the season of Lent on February 14. Epiphany marks the visit of "the **wise men from the East**" who followed a star to find the child Jesus in Judea of Israel. The Greek word for wise men is **magi.** 

The wise men were educated men, scholars, scientists, and interpreters of special signs, especially in astronomy (the study of stars). We know the "East" was Persia, modern day Iran, the location of ancient Babylon. The Jewish nation was in exile in Babylon and Daniel was one of their young men who was chosen to become an important government advisor to the King of Persia 600 years before Jesus was born.

Daniel's life is told in the book of Daniel in the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) of the Bible. Many people know the story of Daniel in the lion's den. Daniel was faithful to God and God blessed him. Daniel's writing foretold the coming of a Messiah (Daniel 9:24-26). Numbers 24:17 records that a promised Messiah was to be announced by a star. Ten thousands of Jewish people were exiled in Babylon from 598 BC for 70 years (Jeremiah 29:10) so there has been much Jewish influence in that part of the world since that time.

The wise men knew much about the Hebrew Scriptures and were familiar with the Jewish religion. When they saw the star in the sky, they wanted to investigate the birth of a King! Many scholars believe this huge star was actually the conjunction (meeting) of two planets: Jupiter, the largest planet, signified a King. Saturn was called the "Protector of Israel." Together this conjunction meant a king was





born in Israel. The wise men followed this star for many months over the hot desert sands to Israel. Their story is told in Matthew 2:1—12. They stopped in the capital of Jerusalem where they were told to go to **Bethlehem as the prophet Micah foretold** (Micah 5:2).

We see how God planned this birth long before it happened. He told poor Jewish shepherds and rich foreign Gentile scientists about this birth. He wanted the world to know! Jesus was born for ALL PEOPLE everywhere. This was an epiphany—a revealing of the Light of the World.
